2. Committee member Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, 'THAT, the committee approve payment of the bills submitted through May 3, 2019.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Vice-Chairman Henry Dupre recognized Chamber of Commerce representatives Ed Stock and Jane Boudreaux. Ed Stock stated that the 25th Annual Banquet was a huge success with over 200 people in attendance. He stated that Superintendent Jeremy Couvillion gave a great message and several outstanding students received academic awards. He then stated that the Chamber will host a new function this year being it is an election year. It will be entitled Meet the Candidate and will be opened to chamber members only. He then stated that it will be held on September 12th and 26th in Pierre Part and Napoleonville, locations to be announced. Mr. Stock added that it will be business oriented since they represent the businesses.
Vice-Chairman Henry Dupre stated that the build-up in industry along the river is tremendous and the most favorable place to help in that is along Hwy 70. Therefore, a discussion needs to begin to bring something in that area to service those industries.
Committee member Booster Breaux stated that they met with Stacy Neal and Vic LaFont regarding getting something moving along Hwy 70. He stated that they will partner with the Chamber as well.
4. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the Chamber of Commerce quarterly report and allocation." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Finance Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Road & Bridge Committee Meeting
Of the
Assumption Parish Police Jury

Wednesday, May 8, 2019
5:15 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Chairman; Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Juror recorded as present was: Mr. Irving Comeaux.
2. Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized Marcus Smith, DOTD, who stated that the high boat traffic at Belle River has been a problem for a few years during the summer months. He stated that last year they performed a traffic count and sent to the Coast Guard, David Blakemore. Following the review, they will allow a temporary opening and closing schedule beginning on May 17, 2019 through August 30, 2019. The bridge will open at the top of every hour and when closed they will not open. He stated that if there are no boats in the que they will not open.
3. Committee member Martin Triche entered the meeting at this time.
4. Mr. Smith stated that Pierre Part Bridge was requested but they don't have as many openings and they didn't have the manpower to perform the traffic count. He further stated they will be meeting to further discuss this bridge area and set up a traffic count for determination. He stated that it will open at 6a.m and close at 10p.m. A brief discussion was then held regarding to emergency vehicles (ambulance).
5. Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated she came up with a summary showing what is in transfer credits (\$652,276) and the construction cost for the three (3) projects (Pear, Mike, Verret Streets) that were proposed. She stated that Pear St. has been approved for \$320,430 and Mike & Verret Streets have cost estimates of \$220,000 and \$149,000. She stated that this is an overage of credits in the amount of \$37,954. The Secretary-Treasurer then stated that the Parish cost consist of engineering, permitting and administration cost (\$97,600) that the credits can't cover or reimburse the Parish for. She stated that the transfer credits can be used for engineering only if DOTD goes out and contracts and engineers the project and they can also pay for admin on their administrative side not reimbursement to the Parish. She further stated that we are three (3) weeks out from final selection of projects and Pear St. has been selected therefore, we need to utilize the remaining funds and make a selection.
Committee member Myron Matherne stated he would eliminate Mike St. because Verret St. is more important.
Committee member Chris Carter stated that 1st St is a small project that can utilize the funds.
The Parish Engineer stated that DOTD suggested that the projects be put straight into overlay and choose a long enough street that will exhaust the funding. It's an efficient want to utilize the funds and get a long distance of overlay done. In response, he stated that he will go out to 1st Street and get a cost estimate.
6. Committee member Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
7. A brief discussion was then held regarding the utilization of the road funds to assist with the credits. Following the discussion committee member Martin Triche proceeded to clarify the usage of the credits and the 1/2% sales tax fund
The Parish Engineer stated that in the past DOTD has used 10% across the board for engineering and 10% for any construction and any administration cost. Therefore, he suggested that 20% of the actual cost be set aside.
Committee member Henry Dupre stated that the patch and go without a foundation or base work is not worth anything. He then suggested that we go with Pear and Verret and get cost estimates for 1st Street and if any funds remain, the Parish Engineer can suggest a small project that those funds will cover.
The Secretary-Treasurer cautioned that the estimate for Pear St. is from 2018 and could possibly change. In response, the Parish Engineer stated that he looked at it and stated that it won't fluctuate that much and an actual cost will not be known until it goes out to bid. He stated that he left some contingency in the numbers for Pear St. due to the float time. Therefore, he stated that he is very comfortable with the estimate that is presented. He then suggested that he speak with DOTD regarding a project that is put in the que and sacrificed to cover the overage.
8. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve submitting Pear St. - \$320,430 and Verret St - \$149,000 Projects for the LA 1247 Road Transfer Credits." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve payment of \$68,400 from the ½% Road Fund for the engineering cost for Pear St. and Verret St. Projects." The motion was unanimously adopted.

10. Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that Coastal Bridge has mobilized back into the Parish. He stated that Gilbert St. will be proof rolling tomorrow for final load testing. If it passes, the street will be paved immediately. The contractor is overlaying in the Bayou L'Ourse area. He stated that his goal is to finish the program within the next 30 days. In response, he explained the rationale moving from area to area and going into Bayou L'Ourse to knock out the base and pulverizing that has to take place first and when the paver enters the Parish it can remain to finalize all the roads. He also explained what is being done on Aristile Road. In response, he stated that there is no excuse for Southall St., they need to take care of it immediately. Mrs. Dawn stated that Southall St. is scheduled to be done on Friday, May 10, 2019. She also stated that the dressing of the shoulder should begin next week as well as Convent St. She then requested and received authorization to work in the Parish on Saturday if the weather permits.
11. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Road & Bridge Committee, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Juror recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that he reviewed the request by DOW Chemical and stated that they are requesting to replace to existing lines. He stated that he has no objection.
3. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the committee approve a letter of 'No Objection' for DOW Chemical Company proposed dual 8" steel pipeline from Well 27 to DOW Well 20.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that Police Juror Chris Carter requested an estimate to design restrooms and Pavillion for Grant Park. He stated that the estimate is \$100,500 and there are grant/recreation funds to cover this cost. A brief discussion was then held regarding the lease agreement and the required amount of years for the investment amount to exceed depreciation cost.
5. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the Parish Engineer to deign restrooms, pavilion and basketball court for Grant Park subject to the ADA reviewing and approving the lease agreement and it meets the public purpose ratio and authorize the President to sign the contracts." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that he bid out the Elmfield Lighting Project and received two (2) bids. He stated that the low bid of \$58,128 was submitted by Rodrigue's Electric and requested approval to accept.
7. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, 'THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bid of \$58,128 submitted by Rodrigue's Electric for the Elmfield Lighting Project.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OHSEP Director, who stated that Blanchard St. is already a public street and there are currently 5 lots. He stated that they are proposing to reconfigure the 5 lot lines into 4. He stated that the submittal of information is fine but there is no water line and it is a parish street.
9. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve the re-division of a tract of land from 5 lots into 4 lots at 111 Blanchard St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. The OHSEP Director stated that he received a variance request to build a shed 8 ft. from the rear setbacks at 102 Landry St. in Pierre Part. He stated that the neighbors have signed stating no objections.
11. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, 'THAT, the committee approve a 2 ft. variance on the rear setbacks at 102 Landry St. in Pierre Part.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
12. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OHSEP Director, who proceeded with the following update on all Disaster Recover Grants:
 - Cancienne Canal Project – We have the new appraiser and he is working on the field survey. Once completed it will be turned over to the review appraiser to complete the review. He then stated that if all goes well we will get the landowners signature then execute the bid process.
 - Marais Sewer Project – The Parish Engineer stated that the project is underway and the equipment has been ordered and they have mobilized in.
 - Sewer Generator Project – The Parish Engineer stated that the project is underway and almost all of the pads have been poured. He stated that the generators have been ordered and are scheduled to arrive at the beginning of June.
 - Linear Park – The Parish Engineer stated that he reached out to a DOTD representative and is awaiting a call back from the coordinator. In response, he stated that the last time he

heard the Parish was on track with the project. He also stated that he will send an email out and copy President Triche. In response, committee member Martin Triche suggested that Representatives Brown and Amadee and Senator Ward be copied on that email. Following a brief discussion, the Parish Engineer stated that the head of the review process has been changed twice.

- Wastewater Generator Project – Goes along with the CDBG Disaster Recovery Project.
- Hazardous Mitigation Project – Have not received any word on the grant that was submitted for the safe room at the Waterworks.

13. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, “THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned.” The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Chris Carter, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Chris Carter led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of April 24, 2019." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the items listed on the agenda. He recognized Leroy Blanchard, who stated that he would like Little Grand Bayou, camp vicinity north east corner of the lake at the end where the parish maintains the road, to be included within the No Wake ordinance as a permanent location for no wake. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following; reappointing Tina Landry to the Bayou Pierre Part North Gravity Drainage District #7 for a 5 yr. term, \$700 for 247 Hwy 1011 Culvert Replacement Project, \$900 for 115 Fertita Lane Culvert Repair Project, \$450 for B&L St. Ditching Project (left side), \$2,000 to extend the rental for the 6" Pump and \$600 for Landry Subdivision Drainage District Outfall Project.
7. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
8. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Patrick Johnson, who stated that the boundaries of Lower Texas Drainage District were submitted to the Assessor's Office to look and consider for parcel or millage for the entire area. He also stated that they are looking into adding a few more residents to the district.
9. President Martin Triche recognized Finance Committee Vice-Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following; payment of the bills submitted through May 3, 2019 and accepted the Chamber of Commerce quarterly report and the allocation.
10. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
11. President Martin Triche recognized Road & Bridge Committee Chairman Ron Alcorn, who stated that Marcus Smith, DOTD, informed them that the Belle River bridge will have a temporary opening and closing schedule beginning on May 17, 2019 through August 30, 2019 at the top of each hour and will look into a schedule for the Pierre Part Bridge also, approved submitting Pear St. - \$320,430 and Verret St - \$149,000 Projects for the LA 1247 Road Transfer Credits, payment of \$68,400 from the ½% Road Fund for the engineering cost for Pear St. and Verret St. Projects, authorized the Parish Engineer to submit a cost for 1st St. Project and received an update on the Road Overlay Program.
12. Police Juror Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Road & Bridge Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
13. President Martin Triche recognized Economic Development Committee Chairman Booster Breaux, who stated that the committee met and discussed highlighting a few businesses of the month at the 1st meeting of every month. He also stated that they considered pairing with the Chamber of Commerce.
14. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following: a letter of 'No Objection' for DOW Chemical Company proposed dual 8" steel pipeline from Well 27 to DOW Well 20, authorize the Parish Engineer to design restrooms, pavilion and basketball court for Grant Park subject to the ADA reviewing and approving the lease agreement and it meeting the public

purpose ratio and authorize the President to sign the contracts, accept the low bid of \$58,128 submitted by Rodrigue's Electric for the Elmfield Lighting Project and authorize the President to sign, re-division of a tract of land from 5 lots into 4 lots at 111 Blanchard St., a 2 ft. variance on the rear setbacks at 102 Landry St. in Pierre Part and an update on the Disaster Recovery Grants.

15. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
16. President Martin Triche recognized Ryan Perque, Executive Director, Friends of Bayou Lafourche, who gave a brief history of Friends of Bayou Lafourche. He then stated that as an attempt to increase the outreach in Assumption, a Meet & Greet was held and one of the visions was to see more recreational projects (walking trails, floating docs, parking lots, bathrooms) on the bayou. They started researching grant opportunities that would apply to these request. He stated that they identified the Recreational Trails Program Grant which is where federal funds are sent down and administered through state government. He then stated that as they pondered, they considered the area across from Assumption Parish High School as a great opportunity since there was currently a pavilion with seating and a circular walking trail. He further explained the attributes of making three connections that could be sold to the board that would make the determination. He stated that these connections would be to provide a floating doc, to connect a floating doc to the existing circular walking trail and connecting the walking trail to the pedestrian bridge. He continued with pictures of the floating docs and connections of the walking trail to the pedestrian bridge. Mr. Perque then stated that the grant is an 80-20 match where they would provide 80% up to \$100,000. Therefore, looking at the floating doc, the trail that connects to the floating doc, the concrete trail from the circular path to the pedestrian bridge, the boardwalk and the miscellaneous supplies (benches, signs, garbage receptacles, etc) the grant would pay for. He added that the numbers presented are adjustable and submitted for the sake of the presentation. He further stated that if the Parish is willing to proceed with this project, they are interested in serving as project manager for the grant. He then stated that the Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District has verbally agreed to assist with tree and log clearing and installation of floating doc. He stated that he would need the Parish to supply labor and earth work which can be provided in house through survey and engineering. The match does not have to be cash it can be in kind work. In response to who will prepare the application, Mr. Perque stated that they would prepare everything. He further explained that they have utilized this grant application previously, it's process and the requirement of a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the Parish and Friends of Bayou Lafourche. He added that once completed, Assumption Parish Police Jury becomes the owner of the project. In response, he stated that he will be meeting with the Superintendent to discuss the project on Wednesday. President Martin Triche stated that he would also like to be a part of the meeting with the Superintendent. He then asked what is needed from the Parish. In response, Mr. Perque stated that if Parish is interested in moving forward they would need a CEA, a commitment from the Parish of \$20,000, earth work and miscellaneous labor.
President Martin Triche stated that he is in favor of the project and would like to authorize up to \$20,000 to assist in the project endeavor.
A brief discussion was held regarding option 2 and its benefits. Following the discussion, President Martin Triche suggested that the Jury authorize the ADA to work with Mr. Perque in drafting a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement, the Parish agree to earmark \$20,000 of recreational funds to move forward with Option 1 and the School Board & Superintendent agree to participate by granting right of ways to their property.
17. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, the Police Jury approve an allocation of \$20,000 from Ward 5 Recreation and authorize the ADA to work with Mr. Ryan Perque, Friends of Bayou Lafourche, in drafting a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement for a Recreational Trails Program Grant subject to the participation of the School Board & Superintendent by granting right of ways to their property." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
18. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a resolution holding of an election in Landry Subdivision Gravity Drainage District #7, Saturday, October 12, 2019." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
19. President Martin Triche recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that she received a request from Shelby Gaudet and 7 other residents regarding an amendment to the No Wake Zone ordinance 17-03. Their request is to add Bayou Pierre Part from little Pierre Part Bay to the last building going south on Pierre Part Bay. President Martin Triche also stated that Mr. Blanchard also request the Little Grand Bayou, In the vicinity of the camps, to be added as a permanent location. Following a brief discussion, Police Juror Booster Breaux stated that he will confer with the residents and report back to the Jury. The Police Jury took no action.
20. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a Can Shake permit for Knights of Peter Claver Ct. #23." The motion was unanimously adopted.

21. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license for Mamma's Wrecker & Roadside, LLC subject to it not being a storage yard." The motion was adopted with Myron Matherne voting nay.
