

**CHAPTER 24**  
**SPECIAL DISTRICTS**

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**Sub-Chapter A**

**In General**

**SECTION 24:1. SPECIAL DISTRICT BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS;  
POWER OF POLICE JURY TO ABOLISH AND EXERCISE  
CONTROLS**

The governing authority of local governmental subdivision shall have general power over any agency heretofore or hereafter created by it, including, without limitation, the power to abolish the agency and require prior approval of any charge or tax levied or bond issued by the agency. (Section 15, Article VI, Louisiana Constitution, 1974)

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**Comment** -- As indicated by the source note, the provisions of the above Section and the Section that follows were derived from the new Louisiana Constitution and not from any local ordinance. Because the provisions are self operative and add to the matters of law herein contained, they were included in this Code for the convenience of the user.

**SECTION 24:2. POWER OF POLICE JURY TO CONSOLIDATE AND MERGE  
ITSELF INTO ANY SPECIAL DISTRICT; LIMITATIONS  
AND CONDITIONS; ASSUMPTION OF DEBT**

A. A local governmental subdivision may consolidate and merge into itself any special district or local public agency, except a school district, situated and having jurisdiction entirely within the boundaries of the local governmental subdivision. Upon the consolidation and merger, the local governmental subdivision shall succeed to and be vested with all of the rights, revenues, resources, jurisdiction, authority, and powers of the special district or local public agency. A consolidation and merger shall become effective only if approved by a majority of the electors

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voting thereon in the local governmental subdivision as a whole and by a majority of the electors voting thereon in the affected special district. A local public agency shall be consolidated and merged only if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon in an election held for that purpose in the local governmental subdivision in which the agency is located.

B. If the special district or local public agency which is consolidated and merged has outstanding indebtedness, the authority provided by this Section shall not be exercised unless provision is made for the assumption of the indebtedness by the governing authority of the local governmental subdivision involved.

**Sub-Chapter B**

**Drainage Districts\***

**SECTION 24:50. DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 5 CREATED; BOUNDARIES; DOMICILE; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS; POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. Whereas in the opinion of the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption it is necessary and conducive to the general welfare of certain property owners of the Parish of Assumption that a drainage district be organized and created comprising certain lands situated in the Parish of Assumption on the right descending bank of Bayou Lafourche, for the purpose of more readily draining the described lands in the Parish. It is, therefore, hereby ordained by the Police Jury that, by virtue of and in pursuant to the power vested in this body by Act No. 12 of 1900 and Act No. 159 of 1902, amending the Act of 1900, all that part of the Parish of Assumption lying on the west bank of Bayou Lafourche, between the lower line of the Enola Plantation of Henry A. Munson and the lower line of the Town of Paincourtville, and the canal dug by the Westfield Planting Company in the rear, shall be embraced in the limits of a drainage district to be known and styled "Drainage District No. 5".

B. The Drainage District is hereby constituted a body corporate with all the powers of a corporation; it shall have the power and the right to incur debts and contract obligations, to sue and be sued, to have and to use a corporate seal, and to do and to perform any and all acts in its corporate capacity and in its corporate name necessary and proper for the carrying out the objects and purposes of this section. The domicile of the Drainage District shall be, and the same is hereby fixed, at the Parish of Assumption, at which domicile it shall be sued and service of citation made on the President either in person or at his domicile, whatever it may be as in the case of ordinary suit.

C. The Drainage District shall meet as often as it may be necessary, provided at least two (2) meetings shall be had each year. A majority of the commissioners shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

D. The Drainage Board of Commissioners shall have the power and it shall be their duty to open all natural drains which they may deem necessary in their district and to perform all work therewith connected which they may deem necessary to make the opening of the natural drains effective. They shall have full power to make contracts for that purpose.

E. The Drainage District and commissioners thereof shall have full power to secure rights of way necessary for the cutting of canals or other work for the drainage of their district and to do this, they shall have the power to bring expropriations suits, and expropriate all lands that may be necessary for the purpose of securing such rights of way.

F. The incurring of debts, the issuance of bonds and the levying of taxes for the purpose of carrying out the drainage system herein provided for shall be in accordance with Article 281 of the Constitution of 1898 and the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana carrying into effect said Article of the Constitution.

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G. The Drainage District hereby created shall be governed and controlled by five (5) commissioners to be known as the Board of Commissioners. These commissioners, or their respective spouses must each be the record owner of real estate in the district of an assessed value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or they must be the representative of some corporation owning lands in the district of an assessed value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The representative of a corporation who may be an officer thereof may be designated to represent the corporation by resolution of the board of directors to that effect. Persons possessing the qualifications may be drainage commissioners, whether they be residents or non-residents. A drainage commissioner may hold the position of drainage commissioner in one or more drainage districts and may hold the position in addition to any other office that may be held by him. The holding of the position of drainage commissioner, shall not be considered in contemplation of law as dual office holding. No commissioner, unless he be the secretary-treasurer shall receive compensation for his services in excess of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per day including all actual expenses, while attending to the business of the district.

H. At the time and place designated by the Police Jury in the ordinance creating the drainage district, or as soon thereafter as possible, the commissioners appointed in the ordinance shall meet and immediately organize by electing officers. They shall elect from among their number a president and vice-president. The president shall preside over the meetings of the commissioners and perform the duties usually required of presidents of corporate bodies. The vice-president shall perform the duties of the president in case of his absence or disability.

1. The commissioners shall also elect a secretary-treasurer, who need not be a commissioner, who shall perform all duties required of him by the commissioners.

2. The secretary-treasurer shall furnish bond in a sum fixed by the Board of Commissioners, which bond shall not be for less than one-fourth over and above any amount that may come into the possession of the secretary-treasurer, and which shall be increased or diminished accordingly. The premium on the bond shall be paid by the District. The secretary-treasurer shall receive compensation not in excess of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), per month, which the board of commissioners may determine.

3. The Board of Commissioners shall adopt a suitable seal, and shall select without the necessity of advertising or receiving bids therefor one or more solvent chartered banks of the state, and other things being equal, a bank or banks situated within the drainage district, in which all funds of the drainage district derived from taxation shall be deposited. The depository shall pay not less than three per centum interest on daily balances.

a. Funds for the district shall be withdrawn or paid out only on warrants or checks of the Board of Commissioners signed in the manner provided by the Board of Commissioners.

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**Sub-Chapter C**

**Gravity Drainage Districts\***

**SECTION 24:100. GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 2 CREATED;  
BOUNDARIES; DOMICILE; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS;  
POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. Gravity Drainage District No. 2 be and the same is hereby created and established, under the provisions of Act No. 317 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, of the year 1910, and the Acts amendatory thereto, the same to consist of and be composed of all the lands lying in the Parish of Assumption and State of Louisiana, on the east bank of Bayou Lafourche, and embraced within the following limits and bounds as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on Bayou Lafourche, at the lower line of the plantation of Edmond E. Webre, and from thence running back to the eighty arpent line of said plantation, thence along the eighty arpent line North to the upper line of Albermarle Plantation, thence north twenty degrees, west ninety five chains, thence north one hundred chains, thence north thirty-three and one half degrees, west two hundred and fifty two chains, thence north two and one quarter degrees east one hundred chains, thence following Bayou Platt north one hundred and twenty chains, thence north sixty one degrees and forty-five minutes, east ninety chains, thence north eighteen degrees, east one hundred and ten chains, thence west one hundred and eighty chains (the line dividing sections forty-two, forty-three and one hundred and thirty one into North and South halves), thence south forty-two and one-half degrees west twenty chains, to the upper line of the Alleman Planting Company's plantation on the eighty arpent line, thence along the upper line of the Alleman Company's plantation from the eighty arpent line to Bayou Lafourche, thence following the meanders of Bayou Lafourche to the point of beginning.

The same containing approximately twenty five thousand (25,000) acres of land, more or less.

B. Assumption Gravity Drainage District No. 2 shall constitute a body corporate in law, with all the powers of a corporation; it shall have perpetual existence; shall have the power and right to incur debts and contract obligations; to be sued and to sue; to have a corporate seal and to do and perform any and all acts in its corporate capacity and in its corporate name, conferred upon it by law and necessary and proper for the carrying out of the purposes and objects of its creation.

C. The domicile of this Drainage District shall be at Plattenville in the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, provided that a place other than the domicile for holding their meetings, after said Drainage District shall have organized by meeting at its domicile as herein designated, may be designated in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 135 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1918.

D. The Gravity Drainage District herein created shall be governed and controlled by five (5) commissioners, who shall be the governing authority of the District. These commissioners or their wives must be assessed with real estate in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or they must be the representatives of some corporation owning lands in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The representative of a corporation may be an officer of the corporation, or may be some person not connected with the corporation as officer or stockholder, but is designated to represent the corporation by a resolution of the board of directors to that effect. Persons possessing the qualifications, or persons thus designated to represent a

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corporation, may be drainage commissioners, whether they be residents or non-residents. A drainage commissioner may hold the position of drainage commissioner in two or more drainage districts and may hold these positions in addition to any other office that may be held by him, and the holding of position as drainage commissioner shall not be considered in contemplation of law as dual office holding.

E. The Police Jury shall appoint the five (5) commissioners for the district herein created. Two (2) of the first commissioners so appointed shall be named to serve for terms of two (2) years each, and the other three (3), for terms of four (4) years each. Thereafter, all selections or appointments shall be for the term of four (4) years. The appointment of commissioners by the Police Jury shall be made upon the petition or recommendation of a majority in number of acres or a majority of the resident land owners in the district, provided the district contains forty (40) or less land owners. If more than forty (40) land owners are embraced in the district, the appointment shall be made upon the recommendation of twenty-five (25) of the land owners of the district. Where there is a contest of the appointment of commissioners, the Police Jury shall give the appointment to those commissioners who are recommended by the land owners owning the greatest number of acres of land in the district. In the absence of any petition or recommendation, the Police Jury may appoint commissioners in their discretion.

Rather than codify those appointments, the provisions of LRS 38:1758 and 38:1759, which govern the appointment of commissioners, qualifications of members, etc., were inserted instead as Sub-Sections D and E.

Also, the ordinance provided that two of the commissioners were to be appointed by the Governor. This was required under LRS 38:1759 as it was written at the time the ordinance was adopted. This statute has since been changed, giving the local governing bodies the authority to appoint all of the commissioners. **SECTION 24:101. GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 4 CREATED;  
BOUNDARIES; DOMICILE; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS;  
POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. Gravity Drainage District No. 4 be and the same is hereby created and established, under the provisions of Act No. 317 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, in the year 1910, and the acts amendatory thereto the same to consist of and be composed of all the lands lying in the Parish of Assumption and State of Louisiana, on the West Bank of Bayou Lafourche and embraced within the following limits and bounded as follows to-wit:

Beginning at a point on Bayou St. Vincent; thence north 48 1/2 degrees West three hundred chains to Brusley St. Vincent road; thence following the Brusley St. Vincent road North 10 1/2 degrees East 5.00; thence North 13 1/2 degrees East 22.7; thence North 37 1/2 degrees East 9.6; thence North 27 1/4 degrees East 13.8; thence North 29 degrees East 5.00; thence North 21 degrees East, 10.6; thence North 25 1/2 degrees East 27.27; thence North 18 degrees West, 4.54; thence South 55 degrees East, 40.03; thence North 48 degrees East 98.38 to Bayou Lafourche, Town of Paincourtville; thence following down the meanders of Bayou Lafourche 344.0 to the lower line of Chas Boudreaux Co. Ltd; thence following Chas Boudreaux Co. Ltd's lower line or Munson's lane North 75 3/4 degrees West 116.51; thence South 75 1/2 degrees West 7.56; thence North 71 1/2 degrees West 17.02; thence North 56 1/2 degrees West 15.12; thence South 83 1/2 degrees West 7.56; thence South 60 degrees West 7.56; thence South 74 1/2 degrees West 10.30; thence South 60 degrees West 5.00 chains to point of beginning, at this point drainage canal continues down Bayou St. Vincent and connect with Dugas & LeBlanc's canal, which goes into Lake Verret.

The same containing approximately three thousand (3,000) acres of land, more or less.

B. Gravity Drainage District No. 4 shall constitute a body corporate in law, with all the powers of a corporation; it shall have perpetual existence; shall have the power and right to incur debts and contract obligations; to be sued and to sue; to have a corporate seal and to do and perform any and all acts of its corporate capacity and in its corporate name, conferred upon it by law and necessary and proper for the carrying out of the purposes and objects of its creation.

C. The domicile of the Drainage District shall be at Paincourtville, Louisiana, in the Parish of Assumption and State of Louisiana, provided that a place other than the domicile for holding their meetings, after the Drainage District shall have organized by meeting at its domicile as herein designated, may be designated in accordance with the provisions of Act 135 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1918.

D. The Gravity Drainage District herein created shall be governed and controlled by five (5) commissioners, who shall be the governing authority of the District. These commissioners or their wives must be assessed with real estate in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or they must be the representatives of some corporation owning lands in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The representative of a corporation may be an officer of the corporation, or may be some person not connected with the corporation as officer or stockholder, but is designated to represent the corporation by a resolution of the board of directors to that effect. 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**SECTION 24:102. BRUSLEY-ST. MARTIN GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT  
NO. 5 CREATED; BOUNDARIES; DOMICILE; BOARD OF  
COMMISSIONERS; POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. The following described territory in Parish of Assumption is created into a gravity drainage district:

Beginning at a point marked "A" on Bayou Lafourche at the Northwest corner of Section 13 Township 12 South, Range 14 East, and thence running North 76 degrees west 12,750 feet to a point marked "B" on the rear line of Section 3, Township 12 South, Range 13 East, and thence running North 7 degrees and 40 minutes east, 1300 feet to a point marked "C" on the rear line of Section 3, Township 12 South, Range 13 East; thence running North 89 degrees 20 minutes west, 2,125 feet to a point marked "D" which is 875 feet north of the center of Section 31 Township 12 South, Range 13 East; thence running due South 875 feet to a point marked "E" in the center of Section 31 Township 12 South, Range 13 East, and thence running due west, 2,687 feet to a point marked "F" on the east line of Section 30, Township 12 South, Range 13 East; thence running due South, 2,562 feet to a point marked "G" at the Southeast corner of Section 30, Township 12 South, Range 13 East, and thence running due East, 1,250 feet to a point marked "H" on the upper line of Section 32, Township 12 South, Range 14 East, and thence running due South, 687 feet to a point marked "I", thence running South 89 degrees east, 1,250 feet to a point marked "J" on the east line of Section 32, Township 12 South, Range 13 East, and thence running South 24 degrees 10 minutes east, 1,875 feet to a point marked "K" on the south line of Section 7, Township 12 South, Range 13 East; thence running South 79 degrees 50 minutes east, 3,500 feet to a point marked "L" on the lower line of Section 56, Township 12 South, Range 14 East, thence running North 7 degrees 30 minutes East, 1,125 feet to a point marked "M" on the south line of Section 53, Township 12 South, Range 14 East, and thence running South 79 degrees 50 minutes East, 10,750 feet to a point marked "N" on Bayou Lafourche at the southeast corner of Section 15, Township 12 South, Range 14 East; thence running and following the meanders of Bayou Lafourche to the point of beginning and marked "A".

B. This gravity drainage district shall be known as "Brusley-St. Martin Gravity Drainage District Number 5" of the Parish of Assumption, and as such shall enjoy all powers and privileges granted to gravity drainage districts under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana, including Section 14, Article 14, of the Constitution of 1921, and Act 238 of 1924, as amended.

C. The Gravity Drainage District herein created shall be governed and controlled by five (5) commissioners, who shall be the governing authority of the District. These commissioners or their wives must be assessed with real estate in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or they must be the representatives of some corporation owning lands in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The representative of a corporation may be an officer of the corporation, or may be some person not connected with the corporation as officer or stockholder, but is designated to represent the corporation by a resolution of the board of directors to that effect. Persons possessing the qualifications, or persons thus designated to represent a corporation, may be drainage commissioners, whether they be residents or non-residents. A drainage commissioner may hold the position of drainage commissioner in two or more drainage districts and may hold these positions in addition to any other office that may be held by him, and the holding of position as drainage commissioner shall not be considered in contemplation of law as dual office holding.

**SECTION 24:103. GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 5 CREATED;  
BOUNDARIES; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

A. Gravity Drainage District No. 5 of Assumption Parish is hereby created and that all lands encompassed within the following bounds shall be included in said district:

Bounded on the North and East by property of Savoie Farms, Inc.; Bounded on the South and East by the property of Irving J. LeBlanc which is adjacent to the property of Lee Verret; Bounded of the West and South by Louisiana Highway No. 308.

B. The Gravity Drainage District herein created shall be governed and controlled by five (5) commissioners, who shall be the governing authority of the District. These commissioners or their wives must be assessed with real estate in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or they must be the representatives of some corporation owning lands in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The representative of a corporation may be an officer of the corporation, or may be some person not connected with the corporation as officer or stockholder, but is designated to represent the corporation by a resolution of the board of directors to that effect. Persons possessing the qualifications, or persons thus designated to represent a corporation, may be drainage commissioners, whether they be residents or non-residents. **SECTION 24:104. MARAIS GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT CREATED;  
BOUNDARIES; DOMICILE; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS;  
POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. A drainage district be and is hereby created in the Parish of Assumption to be known as the Marais Gravity Drainage District. The limits of this Drainage District shall be as follows:

Beginning on the right descending edge of Bayou Lafourche, at the place where the Hermitage Lane meets the public road along Bayou Lafourche; thence west along said Hermitage Lane and the upper line of the land of C.C. Barton, to a distance of twenty-one arpents from Bayou Lafourche; thence south parallel with Bayou Lafourche to the boundary line between Oakley and Little Texas Plantations; thence west along said boundary line to a distance of twenty-nine arpents from Bayou Lafourche, thence south parallel with Bayou Lafourche to the boundary line between Oakley Plantation and the land of Maturin Blanchard; thence west along said boundary line between Oakley Plantation and Blanchard, to the rear end of said land of Maturin Blanchard; thence south along the rear line of said land of Maturin Blanchard to the north boundary of Gregoine Blanchard; thence west along said north line of Gregoine Blanchard, to the League Square; thence south along the east boundary of the League Square to the lower rear corner of the land of Leonir Boudreaux; thence east along the line between the land of Leonir Boudreaux and Ravenswood Plantation, to a point twenty-two arpents from Bayou Lafourche; thence south parallel with Bayou Lafourche to the boundary line between Ravenswood and Mr. Lawrence Plantations; thence south across Mr. Lawrence and Himalaya Plantations to a point twenty arpents from Bayou Lafourche on the lower line of the Pugh Himalaya Plantation; thence east along the line between Himalaya and Georgia Plantations to the corner of the land of W. W. Tallerie; thence north along the rear line of W. W. Tallerie, to the Tallerie lane; thence east along said lane to Bayou Lafourche; thence north following the west edge of Bayou Lafourche to the point of beginning.

B. This Drainage District shall be a body corporate in law with all such powers, rights, duties and obligations as are conferred upon them by the laws of the State of Louisiana, and particularly by Act 159 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of 1902, as amended by Act 61 of 1904.

C. The domicile of the district shall be the Parish of Assumption.

D. The Gravity Drainage District herein created shall be governed and controlled by five (5) commissioners, who shall be the governing authority of the District. These commissioners or their wives must be assessed with real estate in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or they must be the representatives of some corporation owning lands in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The representative of a corporation may be an officer of the corporation, or may be some person not connected with the corporation as officer or stockholder, but is designated to represent the corporation by a resolution of the board of directors to that effect. Persons possessing the qualifications, or persons thus designated to represent a

corporation, may be drainage commissioners, whether they be residents or non-residents. A drainage commissioner may hold the position of drainage commissioner in two or more drainage districts and may hold these positions in addition to any other office that may be held by him, and the holding of position as drainage commissioner shall not be considered in contemplation of law as dual office holding.

E. The Police Jury shall appoint the five (5) commissioners for the district herein created. Two (2) of the first commissioners so appointed shall be named to serve for terms of two (2) years each, and the other three (3), for terms of four (4) years each. Thereafter, all selections or appointments shall be for the term of four (4) years. The appointment of commissioners by the Police Jury shall be made upon the petition or recommendation of a majority in number of acres or a majority of the resident land owners in the district, provided the district contains forty (40) or less land owners. If more than forty (40) land owners are embraced in the district, the appointment shall be made upon the recommendation of twenty-five (25) of the land owners of the district. Where there is a contest of the appointment of commissioners, the Police Jury shall give the appointment to those commissioners who are recommended by the land owners owning the greatest number of acres of land in the district. In the absence of any petition or recommendation, the Police Jury may appoint commissioners in their discretion.

(Ordinance of March 14, 1907)

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**Comment** -- Sections 3 and 5 of the ordinance from which the above section was derived provided for the appointment of the first set of district commissioners. Rather than codify those appointments, the provisions of LRS 38:1758 and 38:1759, which govern the appointment of commissioners, qualifications of members, etc., were inserted instead as Sub-Sections D and E.

Also, the ordinance provided that two of the commissioners were to be appointed by the Governor. This was required under LRS 38:1759 as it was written at the time the ordinance was adopted. This statute has since been changed, giving the local governing bodies the authority to appoint all of the commissioners. The language of the source ordinance was therefore modified for this codification and revised based on the provisions of the revised state law.

**SECTION 24:105.            HARDTIMES GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT CREATED;  
BOUNDARIES; DOMICILE; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS;  
POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. The Hardtimes Gravity Drainage District, be and the same is hereby created and established, under the provisions of Act. No. 317, of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, in the year 1910, and the acts amendatory thereto the same to consist of and be composed of all the lands lying in the Parish of Assumption and State of Louisiana, on the right descending bank of Bayou Lafourche and embraced within the following limits and bounded as follows, to wit:

Commencing at a point on Cancienne Canal, being the rear bank of the present Blanchard Clause drainage ditch where it intersects the said Cancienne Canal, and following the rear bank of said ditch to the upper line of the land of Willie Clause; thence toward the rear along the upper line of the said land of Willie Clause to the forty arpent line; thence along the rear line of Seraphine Thibodaux, Bank of Labadie, Paul Guepet, Bank of Labadie, Chas. Barrilleaux, Desire Boudreaux, Thibaut Brothers, and Alfred Blanchard; thence along the upper line of said Alfred Blanchard, known as Poverty Point Plantation to Bayou Lafourche, thence along the right descending bank of Bayou Lafourche to Cancienne Canal; thence along the upper bank of said Cancienne Canal to the point of beginning.

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The said lands containing approximately fifteen hundred (1,500) acres more or less.

B. The Hardtimes Drainage District shall constitute a body corporate in law, with all the powers of a corporation; it shall have perpetual existence; shall have power and right to incur debts and contract obligations; to be sued and to sue; to have a corporate seal and to do and perform any and all acts of its corporate capacity and in its corporate name, conferred upon it by law and necessary and proper for the carrying out of the purposes and objects of its creation.

C. The domicile of the Drainage District shall be at Napoleonville, Louisiana provided that a place other than the domicile for holding their meetings, after said Drainage District shall have been organized by meeting at its domicile as herein designated, may be designated in accordance with the provisions of Act 135 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1918.

D. The Gravity Drainage District herein created shall be governed and controlled by five (5) commissioners, who shall be the governing authority of the District. These commissioners or their wives must be assessed with real estate in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or they must be the representatives of some corporation owning lands in the district to the value of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The representative of a corporation may be an officer of the corporation, or may be some person not connected with the corporation as officer or stockholder, but is designated to represent the corporation by a resolution of the board of directors to that effect. Persons possessing the qualifications, or persons thus designated to represent a corporation, may be drainage commissioners, whether they be residents or non-residents. A drainage commissioner may hold the position of drainage commissioner in two or more drainage districts and may hold these positions in addition to any other office that may be held by him, and the holding of position as drainage commissioner shall not be considered in contemplation of law as dual office holding.

E. The Police Jury shall appoint the five (5) commissioners for the district herein created. The "Bayou L'Ourse Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Assumption, Louisiana" be and is hereby created, to be composed of the lands hereinbelow described, located in that portion of the Parish of Assumption known as the Bayou L'Ourse Community, the boundaries of said District are as follows:

Phase I

A tract of land known as the Oakridge Drainage District, located in Sections 23, 26 & 35, Township 13 South, Range 12 East in the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana and Phase I more particularly described as follows:

Begin at intersection of the centerline of Renee Street (a Parish road) and the easterly right-of-way of Louisiana Highway 70. **SECTION 24:250. HOSPITAL SERVICE DISTRICT NO. 1 CREATED; BOUNDARIES; DESIGNATED TITLE; APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSIONERS AND TERMS; DOMICILE AND ORGANIZATION**

A. Under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Sections 1051 to 1068, inclusive, of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 46:1051 to R.S. 46:1068 inclusive), a hospital service district is hereby created within the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, which hospital service district shall comprise and embrace all of the territory within the Parish of Assumption as presently constituted, the boundaries of which shall be coextensive with the boundaries of the Parish of Assumption.

B. This Hospital Service District shall be known and designated as Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, and as thus created shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana and shall have all the powers and privileges granted by the Constitution, laws and statutes of this state to such subdivisions, including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds and to levy taxes.

C. The Hospital Service District shall be governed by a board of five (5) commissioners, hereafter referred to as commission, who shall be qualified voters and residents of the district. The commission shall be appointed by the Police Jury of the Parish. Two (2) of the first commissioners so appointed shall serve for two (2) years, two (2) for four (4) years, and one (1) for six (6) years.

1. At the expiration of their respective terms of office, the successors to such appointees shall be appointed within thirty (30) days for six (6) year terms. The police jury shall fill vacancies in the same manner as the predecessor appointees were selected. The parish governing authority of the parish in which the district is located may permit a per diem to each member of the commission in an amount of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than forty dollars (\$40.00) for each day of his attendance at meetings of the commission, not to exceed twelve (12) meetings per year payable out of the funds of the hospital service district. Any member of the commission may be removed from office for cause and his appointment rescinded by two-thirds vote of the elected membership of the parish governing authority which appointed him.

D. The domicile of the Hospital Service District be and the same is hereby designated as the Town of Napoleonville, Louisiana, which domicile is within the corporate limits of the Hospital Service District.

The Commissioners of Recreation District No. 1 shall be composed of five (5) members, appointed by the Police Jury and shall meet and elect such officers as are required in Section 4564 (B) of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, namely a chairman and vice-chairman from the members of the board and a secretary-treasurer who shall not be a member of the board but shall be a qualified voter and resident of the district.

D. The Village of Labadieville, Louisiana shall be the domicile of Road Lighting District No. 1 of Assumption Parish, Louisiana.

D. The Village of Labadieville, Louisiana, shall be the domicile of Road Lighting District No. 2 of Assumption Parish, Louisiana.

"All lands situated within and comprising Ward One of Assumption Parish, Louisiana." This road lighting district shall be known as Road Lighting District No. 3 of the Parish of Assumption, and, as such, shall enjoy all powers and privileges granted to Road Lighting Districts under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, including Article 14, Section 14, C.1, et seq.

B. The Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption, Louisiana, shall be the governing authority of said Road Lighting District No. 2 of Assumption Parish, and the Parish Treasurer shall be the Treasurer of the District.

C. The First Ward of the Parish of Assumption shall be the domicile of Road Lighting District No. 3 of Assumption Parish, Louisiana.

### Sales Tax Districts

#### **SECTION 24:600. ASSUMPTION PARISH SALES TAX DISTRICT CREATED; DOMICILE; POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. Under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Section 2721.6 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (R.S. 33:2721.6), and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, a Sales Tax District be and the same is hereby created within the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), which Sales Tax District shall comprise and embrace all of that territory within the boundaries of the Parish, excluding that portion contained within the corporate boundaries of the City of Napoleonville, Louisiana, as presently constituted or as may hereafter exist.

B. The Sales Tax District hereby created shall be and is hereby designated as the "Assumption Parish Sales Tax District", and the seal of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, be and the same is hereby adopted as the seal of said District. The governing authority of the District shall be the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the domicile shall be the regular meeting place of said Police Jury, and the officers of said Police Jury shall be the officers of the District.

C. The District shall have all powers granted to it under Louisiana law, including the power to levy a Sales and Use Tax in accordance with Section 2721.6 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and Article VI, Section 29 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and to fund the proceeds thereof into bonds for the purposes for which the Sales Tax is authorized to be used.

R-12-E; Thence in a southerly direction to the Southeast corner of Section 36, being the southeast corner of T-12-S, R-12-E and the northeast corner of T-13-S, R-12-E; Thence, continuing in a southerly direction to the southeast corner of Section 12, T-13-S, R-12-E and southwest corner of Section 7. T-13-S, R-13-E; Thence, in a westerly direction to the corner common to Sections 11, 12, 13 and 14, T-13-S. R-12-E; Thence, in a southerly direction to the corner common to Sections 13, 14, 23 and 24, T-13-S, R-12-E; Thence, in a westerly direction to the corner common to Sections 14, 15, 22 and 23, T-13-S, R-12-E; Thence, in a northerly direction to the corner common to Sections 2 and 3, T-13-S, R-12-E and Sections 34 and 35, T-12-S. R-12-E; Thence, in an easterly direction to the corner common to Sections 1 and 2, T-13-S, R-12-E and Sections 35 and 36, T-12-S, R-12-E; Thence, in a northerly direction to the corner common to Sections 13, 14, 23 and 24, T-12-S, R-12-E; Thence, in an easterly direction to the corner common to Sections 13 and 24, T-12-S, R-12-E and Sections 37 and 38, T-12-S, R-13-E; Thence, continuing in an easterly direction to the corner common to Sections 36, 37, 38 and 39, T-12-S, R-13-E, being the point of beginning. Said area encompassing all of the following: Sections 24, 25 and 36, T-12-S, R-12-E, Sections 38 and 49, T-12-S, R-13-E, Sections 1, 2, 11, 12 and 14, T-13-S, R-12-E, and containing approximately 6,400 acres.

B. The sewerage district hereby created shall be known as "Pierre Part Sewerage District No. 1 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana", and as thus created, shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, and as such, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and statutes of the State of Louisiana including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds and to levy taxes and assessments.

C. In accordance with the provisions of LRS 33:3887, the Police Jury shall appoint three (3) property taxpayers within the district to serve as a board of supervisors thereof. The members of this board shall have all the powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Louisiana during their term of office and until their successors are duly appointed and have qualified.

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Thence, in a southeasterly direction traversing Sections 122 and 123 to a point on the section line common to Sections 123 and 124, said point being a distance of 2400 feet from the center line of Bayou Lafourche measured along the section line; Thence, in a southwesterly direction along the section line a distance of 400 feet to a point; Thence, in a southerly direction paralleling Bayou Lafourche traversing Sections 124, 125, 126 and 127 in T-12-S, R-14-E and traversing Section 50 in T-13-S, R-14-E to a point on the section line common to Sections 50 and 51; Thence, in a northwesterly direction along the section line and thence, along an extension of this line across Bayou Lafourche, said line now being the common section line between Sections 13 and 14, T-13-S, R-14-E to a point on the township line common to T-12-S, and T-13-S; Thence, in a northwesterly direction traversing Sections 135, Spanish Road (Grant), 38, 37, 36, 35, 34, 33, 32, 31 and a portion of Section 30 to a point in the middle of Section 30 a distance of 3500 feet from the center line of Bayou Lafourche; Thence, southwesterly through the center of Section 30 to the center line of State Highway 1165; Thence, northwesterly along said highway to the intersection with the section line common to Sections 30 and 29; Thence, northwesterly traversing Section 29 to the section line common to Sections 29 and 28 to a point, said point being 5200 feet from Bayou Lafourche; Thence, northeasterly along said section line to a point said point being 2000 feet from Bayou Lafourche; Thence, in a northerly direction paralleling Bayou Lafourche, traversing Sections 28 and 27 to a point on the section line common to Sections 27 and 26, said point being 2000 feet from the center line of Bayou Lafourche; Thence, in an easterly direction along said section line a distance of 2000 feet to the center line of Bayou Lafourche; Thence, in a southerly direction down the center line of Bayou Lafourche to the intersection of the projection of Sections 114 and 115 being the point of beginning.

B. The sewerage district hereby created shall be known and is hereby designated as "Sewerage District No. 5 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana", and as thus created, shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, and as such, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and statutes of the State of Louisiana, including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds and to levy taxes and assessments.

C. In accordance with the provisions of LRS 33:3887, the Police Jury shall appoint three (3) property taxpayers within the district to serve as a board of supervisors thereof. The members of this board shall have all the powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Louisiana during their term of office and until their successors are duly appointed and have qualified.

D. The domicile of the sewerage district be and the same is hereby designated as St. Elizabeth Convent Hall, which domicile is within the boundaries of the Sewerage District.

**SECTIONS 24:631. BACK MARAIS SEWERAGE DISTRICT CREATED;  
BOUNDARIES; BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; DOMICILE;  
POWERS AND DUTIES**

A. Under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Sub-Part A, Part 1, Chapter 9, Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, a Sewerage District be and the same is hereby created within the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, which Sewerage District shall comprise and embrace certain territory within the Parish of Assumption, Louisiana, said boundaries being specifically described as follows:

The following described area has been so bounded for the purpose of incorporating a District within the Parish of Assumption to collect taxes to be dedicated for the maintenance of a sewerage collection system and treatment facilities for all users within this bounded area.

The bounded area is as follows:

An area located in Section 8, Township 14 South, Range 14 East, Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana; bounded on the north by Louisiana State Highway 400; bounded on the east by the Marais Canal; bounded on the west by a line paralleling and 500 feet west, of the centerline of Back Marais Lane (Existing Parish Street); bounded on the south by a line paralleling and 2,000 feet south, of the centerline of Louisiana Highway 400 (existing state highway). Presently, this district includes all residences along Back Marais Lane, Clause Street, French Lane, and Coleman-Johnson Street.

B. The Sewerage District hereby created shall be and is hereby designated as "Back Marais Sewerage District of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana," and as thus created, shall constitute a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, and as such, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and statutes of the State of Louisiana, including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds and to levy taxes.

C. In accordance with the provisions of Section 3887 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 33:3887), the Police Jury shall appoint three (3) property taxpayers within the District to serve as a Board of Supervisors thereof. The members of the Board shall serve in their offices at the will of the Police Jury, having all the powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and statutes of the State of Louisiana during their terms of office and until their successors are duly appointed and have qualified.

D. The domicile of said Sewerage District be and the same is hereby designated as the Police Jury Room in the Courthouse, Napoleonville, Louisiana, which domicile is within the corporate limits of said Sewerage District.

**SECTION 24:632. SEWERAGE DISTRICT NO. 7;  
BOUNDARIES; BOARD OF SUPERVISORS;  
POWERS AND DUTIES; DOMICILE**

A. Under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Sub-Part A, Part I, Chapter 9, Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto a Sewerage District be and the same is hereby created within the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, which Sewerage District shall include, comprise and embrace all of that territory within the following described boundaries, to-wit:

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All of that territory located within the boundaries of Sections 67, 68, 69 and 70, Township 14 South, Range 15 East and to the east of La. Hwy. 308 which parallels the left descending bank of Bayou Lafourche in Assumption Parish.

B. The said Sewerage District hereby created shall be known and is hereby designated as **“Sewerage District No. 7 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana”**, and as thus created shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, and as such shall have all the rights, powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Louisiana, including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds and to levy taxes and assessments.

C. In accordance with the provisions of Sections 3886 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 33:3887), three persons and each possessing the qualifications required by law, shall be appointed as Supervisors of said Sewerage District. The said Supervisors hereby appointed shall constitute a Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 7 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, and shall serve in their offices until they resign or are replaced by the Police Jury, having all the powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Louisiana during their terms of office and until their successors are duly appointed and have qualified.

D. The domicile of said Sewerage District be and the same is hereby designated as 137 Violet Street, Labadieville, Louisiana, which domicile is within the corporate limits of said Sewerage District.

**SECTION 24:633. SEWERAGE DISTRICT NO. 8;  
BOUNDARIES; BOARD OF SUPERVISORS;  
POWERS AND DUTIES; DOMICILE**

A. Under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Sub-Part A, Part I, Chapter 9, Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, a Sewerage District be and the same is hereby created within the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, which Sewerage District shall include, comprise and embrace all of that territory within the following described boundaries, to-wit:

All of that territory located within the boundaries of Sections 89, 90, 91, 92, 93, 94, 95, 96, 97, 98, 99 and 100, Township 12 South, Range 14 East, and to the east of La. Hwy. 308 which parallels the left descending bank of Bayou Lafourche in Assumption Parish.

B. That the said Sewerage District hereby created shall be known and is hereby designated as **“Sewerage District No. 8 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana”**, and as thus created shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, and as such shall have all the rights, powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Louisiana, including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds and to levy taxes and assessments.

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C. In accordance with the provisions of Sections 3886 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 33:3887), the Police Jury shall appoint three persons each possessing the qualifications required by law as Supervisors of said Sewerage District. The said Supervisors hereby appointed shall constitute a Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 8 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, and shall serve in their offices until they resign or are replaced by the Police Jury, having all the powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Louisiana during their terms of office and until their successors are duly appointed and have qualified.

D. The domicile of said Sewerage District be and the same is hereby designated as 224 Grisaffe Lane, Belle Rose, Louisiana, which domicile is within the corporate limits of said Sewerage District. (Ordinance of 1/8/97)

## Sub-Chapter O

### Waterworks Districts\*

**SECTION 24:650. WATERWORKS DISTRICT NO. 1 CREATED; BOUNDARIES; DESIGNATED TITLE; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS; DOMICILE; ORGANIZATIONAL PROCEDURE**

A. Under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Chapter 8 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, a waterworks district be and the same is hereby created within the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, which waterworks district shall comprise and embrace all of that territory within the Parish of Assumption, Louisiana, and the boundaries of said waterworks district shall be co-extensive with the boundaries of the parish as presently constituted.

B. The waterworks district shall be known and is hereby designated as "Waterworks District No. 1 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana", and as thus created shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, and shall have all the powers and privileges granted by the Constitution and statutes of this State to such subdivision, including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds and to levy taxes.

C. In accordance with the provisions of Sections 3812 and 3813 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (LRS 33:3812 - 3813) the Police Jury shall appoint five (5) commissioners to govern the district. Each of the individuals appointed shall be residents of the Waterworks District and assessed with not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) worth of real estate in the district.

D. The domicile of the Waterworks District be and the same is hereby designated as the Courthouse, Napoleonville, Louisiana, which domicile is within the corporate limits of the Waterworks District.

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**Comment** -- Section 3 of the source ordinance named the original appointments to the Waterworks District. At the time of adoption, state law provided that the police jury appoint three members and the Governor appoint the remaining two. Rather than codify the individual appointments, the provisions of LRS 33:3812 and 3813 were included as Paragraph C, above.

## Sub-Chapter P

### Fresh Water Districts\*

#### **SECTION 24:700. BAYOU LAFOURCHE FRESH WATER DISTRICT CREATED; BOUNDARIES; BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

A. Act No.113 of the State Legislature of Louisiana for the year 1950 created the Bayou Lafourche Fresh Water District, as a political subdivision of the State, comprising within said district the following territory:

Those parts of the Parishes of Ascension, Assumption and Lafourche, Louisiana, lying along both banks of Bayou Lafourche between the Mississippi River and the Gulf of Mexico and within the lines drawn on each side of said Bayou a distance of four thousand two hundred feet (4,200') from the center of said Bayou Lafourche, as established by government survey, the northern boundary line of said district being the toe of the main Mississippi River levee divorcing the waters of Bayou Lafourche from the Mississippi River, on the river side of said levee as now located, and the southern boundary of said levee as now located, and the southern boundary of said district being the Gulf of Mexico at high tide.

B. Act 113 provides that the affairs of the district shall be governed by a board of commissioners, seven (7) in number, one (1) from the Parish of Ascension, two (2) from the Parish of Assumption, and four (4) from the Parish of Lafourche, to be selected and appointed by the police juries of their respective parishes, and to serve for terms of four (4) years each, beginning with the effective date of said act.

C. Section 3 of Article XV of the Constitution of Louisiana, 1921, as amended, confers upon the legislature the power to so create such district and to so constitute such district.

D. The Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption shall, therefore, select and appoint two (2) residents and qualified electors and property owners of the Parish of Assumption, in accordance with law, to serve as members of the board of commissioners for terms of four (4) years.

## Sub-Chapter Q

### Lighting Districts\*

#### **SECTION 24:800. LEISURE POINT SUBDIVISION, LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. 3**

A. That the following described territory in the Parish of Assumption, Louisiana, is created into a Lighting District.

“That certain tract of land lying and being situated in the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, together with all rights, ways, privileges, servitudes and appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining, more particularly described on the survey plat by David A. Waitz, C.E., entitled “Leisure Point Subdivision Phase I, located in Sections 43 & 44, T13S-R14E, Assumption Parish, Louisiana,” dated May 5, 2003 and revised November 11, 2003, filed November 17, 2003, at COB 240, under Entry No. 213084 of the records of Assumption Parish, Louisiana.

Said Phase I of Leisure Point Subdivision commences along the eastern right-of-way of LA Hwy. No. 1 for a total frontage of 475.01 feet, by a depth on its northern line of 2081.53 feet; a depth of 1968.00 feet on its southern line; and a total of 427.44 feet in the rear, being bounded as follows: In front by LA Hwy. No. 1; along its northern line by Denis A. Thibodaux; along its southern line by property of Stephen LeBlanc, et als; and in the rear by remaining property of Rivere Properties, LLC.”

B. That the Police Jury of the said Parish of Assumption, Louisiana, shall be the governing authority of said Lighting District No. 3 of Assumption Parish, and the Parish Treasurer shall be the Treasurer of the District.

C. That the Village of Napoleonville, Louisiana shall be the domicile of said Lighting District No. 3 of Assumption Parish, Louisiana.
