Insurance Committee Meeting
Of the

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Chairman; Mr. Jamie Ponville, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Michael Dais, Mr. Leroy Blanchard, Mr. Patrick Johnson.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Ron Alcorn stated that it's that time to discuss the renewal of the health insurance coverage. He thanked the employees for completing the questionnaire that was sent out regarding the current health plan. He stated that because this is the number one benefit that's offered to our employees at an affordable price, he stated that he did some research and reached out to the Guy Cormier, Police Jury Association and Yvette Murphy, CCMSI. He stated that there were some pros and cons. Under the Police Jury Association, we are 100% insured with a good structured program. He stated that in 2021 our claims were low with a 5% decrease and CCMSI performed an analysis of our claims giving us an increase of 1% in premium. Chairman Ron Alcorn then stated that the down side is that CCMSI is a 3rd party company hired by the Police Jury Association who administers and processes all of our claims but doesn't shop the market. He stated that Police Jury Association is the carrier of the health care plan, they don't shop the market and only offer medical and dental. He then stated that we are ok at the moment but the Parish has no one fighting for us. He further stated that he is aware of the 6 of the 7 entities that are under this health care plan have an independent agent/broker working on their behalf. He then stated that based on the time frame, in his opinion, the Parish doesn't have enough time for a broker to shop the market and provide us with a reasonable product at an affordable cost. Chairman Alcorn then recommended that the Parish renew the health insurance coverage with CCMSI. He then stated that an alternate recommendation would be to request for qualifications of an independent insurance broker that will work on our behalf of the benefits of the Jury. In response, the Secretary-Treasurer stated that CCMSI does work for us on the affordable act and comes to us with proposals for tasks that have been performed internally to save costs. A brief discussion was held regarding the information presented.
3. Committee member Jamie Ponville offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Leroy Blanchard, "THAT, the committee approve the renewal of health insurance coverage with CCMSI through Parish Government Risk Management Association." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. The Secretary-Treasurer stated that the Parish is looking to host the health fair in November this year.

2. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve payment of the bills submitted through October 7, 2021." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Chairman Patrick Johnson recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that this is an annual CEA between APPJ and the City of Morgan City to house female per-trial detainees and everything is going fine. She recommended that it be renewed at the same term and conditions.
4. Committee member Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve the renewal Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between APPJ and the City of Morgan City to house female detainees for 1 yr. at the same terms and conditions and authorize the President to sign." 5. Chairman Patrick Johnson recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that the Parish is at a point to proceed with the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with OLOL Assumption Community Hospital for the morgue cooler. She stated that the information was reviewed and approved by the ADA and the funding is from a LGAP grant.
6. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, the committee approve a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with OLOL Assumption Community Hospital for the installation of a morgue cooler and authorize the President to sign." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Patrick Johnson recognized a representative of OLOL Assumption Community Hospital, who thanked the Police Jury and stated that they are glad to be moving forward with the Project. In response, the Secretary-Treasurer explained how the bidding process took place and stated that this happened about 45 days ago.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting
Of the

Wednesday, October 13, 2021
5:35 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Leroy Blanchard, Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Michael Dias, Mr. Jamie Ponville, Mr. Patrick Johnson.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Jacob Loeske, GIS Engineering, who stated that they have halted on surveying to get modeling efforts further along. He stated that they began the NRCS application and will submit next week. He stated that the 2-D modeling will tell them what alternative or impact they put and how it's going to impact the other areas. He also stated that they worked with the Corp of Engineers to obtain some data relative to the modeling. He proceeded to state that they are imputing into the model to run flood event and models and then the improvements can be made. A brief discussion was then held regarding the information presented. In response Mr. Loeske stated that relative to the Donner Canal, the plans are when the pump stations are installed that will assist with back water. A brief discussion was held regarding the backwater in the Bayou Black area.
3. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Kevin Belanger, CEO South Central Planning & Development, who stated that for many years they assisted the Police Jury with CDBG and they are going to give an overview of where they stand today and the expectation going forward. He then introduced Mr. Pat Gordon who stated that they have administered several CDBG grants for Assumption Parish and are currently waiting on invoices to close out disaster grants. He stated that they were very limited with CDBG last year due to COVID. He stated that in January the Office of Community Development will be opening up CDBG grants and if Assumption Parish is interested, he suggested that they start talking about it now. He stated that Delta Regional Authority will also have funding available. He spoke about 7 large grants that has to offer throughout the SCPDC region to assist airport commission, port commissions, parish governments in creation of jobs, etc. He then stated that if the parish can tie in infrastructure in the creation of jobs EDA will fund it. In response, he stated that if gas lines will benefit low to moderate income families it can be done even though he has never heard of it being done or requested. He stated that if it affect businesses it may be possible but it must be publicly owned gas company. In response, Kevin Belanger stated that SCPDC did an EDA project for Westfield. The Parish Engineer stated that they applied and received funding for the Waterworks as well as Game Equipment. Mr. Gordon stated that they target low to moderate income areas for water and sewer projects. Police Juror Chris Carter stated that he would like to apply for a sewer grant for Ward 6. In response, Pat Gordon stated that he would like the Police Jury to pass a resolution requesting South Central Planning & Development Commission to prepare a specific application. In response, he stated that the EDF grant can assist with access road to industrial facilities. He then introduced Chris Disher, Cajun Broadband, who gave a brief background of himself, the company and the grant program. He stated that they service 9 parishes and Representative Amedee informed him that Assumption Parish could use some assistance. He stated that Act 477, (the Gumbo Act) will open application beginning November 1, 2021-December 31, 2021. He stated that they have \$90 million in grants for Louisiana and it's offered to providers (Cajun Broadband) to apply directly with the State and strongly encourages the Parish to enter into a CEA. He stated that there is a required 20% match which can come from American Recovery Funds, Private Individuals, etc. He spoke about fiber optic wiring and explained "serviced and underserved". Committee member Leroy Blanchard stated that he has the FCC map from the auction 904 and stated that this map will determine what is underserved. Mr. Disher stated that everyone knows this is a rough map and will determine serviced areas if one (1) customer is serviced. Committee member Leroy Blanchard stated that the map does indicate the areas that are in need of service in the parish. In response, he stated that since the hurricane Spectrum service is horrible and they are working south of the Parish so if they hear that another provider is offering competition, we may get their attention. A brief discussion was then held regarding broadband and applying by the November date. Following the discussion, committee member Leroy Blanchard stated that he will meet with Mr. Disher and review the FCC map and share the information with the Jury. A suggestion was made to seek the use of Delta Regional Authority funds for the 20% match. Following a brief discussion, Mr. Disher stated that if the Jury decides on broadband, he will need a letter from the Parish stating they want to work with Cajun Broadband. He then mentioned EBB which is geared to low-income people that can apply and if qualified, could get up to \$50 off their internet service monthly.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Police Juror Myron Matherne, who stated that he met with a resident of Gerald St. relative to a flood levee to protect the residents of the street. He stated that they met with the Parish Engineer regarding a surveyor to survey the property. The Parish Engineer stated that he would like to get a center line survey at a cost estimate of \$3,000.
5. Committee member Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jamie Ponville, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the Parish Engineer to have a survey done on Gerald St. at a

cost not to exceed \$3,000 to be funded through W9 drainage.” The motion was unanimously adopted.

6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OHSEP Director, who stated that the positive cases of Coronavirus for Assumption Parish is 3,610 with 57 deaths and the vaccinated percentage is 42%.
7. The OHSEP Director then stated they are working hard to get the generator project completed. There are two (2) sites (Georgette St., Grant St.) that need gas meters.
8. Committee member Michael Dias offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, “THAT, the committee approved adding the following matter to the agenda.” The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Chairman Irving Comeaux requested comments, question, or concerns regarding the division of property on Hwy 1. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
10. Committee member Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Leroy Blanchard, “THAT, the committee approve the division of property, five (5) lots on Hwy 1 across from Hwy 1000.” The motion was unanimously adopted. The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. Committee member Patrick Johnson stated that he met with South Central Planning and the Superintendent of Assumption Parish School System relative to redistricting for 2021. He stated that they will use data from 2010 redistricting plan as well as the 2020 census data. He added that there will be a cost share between the two entities.
12. Committee member Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jamie Ponville, “THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned.” The motion was unanimously adopted.

3. President Patrick Johnson led the Prayer and Police Juror Chris Carter led the Pledge Of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Michael Dias, "THAT, the committee approve the minutes of September 22, 2021 and September 28, 2021. The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Patrick Johnson opened the meeting to the public to receive comments questions or concerns regarding matters on the agenda. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
6. ORDINANCE 21-07

Upon a motion presented by **Chris Carter** seconded by **Jamie Ponville**, the following ordinance was presented for adoption:

An Ordinance amending Ordinance 21-05 to authorize the levy of charges for grass Cutting as an assessment to be added to the annual Ad Valorem tax bill of the property involved and/or authorizing the placement of a lien on the property involved for non-payment of grass cutting charges in accordance with Assumption Parish Ordinance No. 89-04 as amended.

Be It Ordained by the Assumption Parish Police Jury, convened in Regular Session on this 13th day of October 2021, that:

Section 1. The following properties, identified by assessment numbers, located within the Parish of Assumption, be levied with the stated charges due plus thirty percent for collection fees for non-payment of grass cutting, and said charges shall become an assessment and form part of the ad valorem taxes due on said property by the owner and when collected shall be credited to the general fund of the parish.

Section 2. The Secretary-Treasurer of the Assumption Parish Police Jury is also hereby authorized and directed to file a special assessment against the subject property for the above charges if collection is not made as a result of action authorized in Section 1 above within 60 days. A certified copy of said special assessment shall be filed with the Clerk of Court of Assumption Parish, who shall forthwith record same in the Mortgage Records of said Parish. Such assessment when so filed and recorded shall operate as a lien and privilege against the property herein assessed, which lien and privilege shall rank from the date of filing of the assessment in the Mortgage Records of said Parish and shall prime all other claims, mortgages and liens, except taxes and prior recorded special assessment liens.

Section 3. If any section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this ordinance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption hereby expressly declaring that it would have passed the remaining portions of this Ordinance with the invalid portions omitted.

Section 4. Other ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.

Section 6. This ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of said Police Jury was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, then vote thereon being as follows:
