The RESTORE Act Multiyear Implementation Plan is now available for public review on the Assumption website. The objective of this plan is to provide a local match for the maintenance of Bayou Chene Floodgate. The Floodgate was recently completed at a cost of \$80,000,000 for the protection of several coastal parishes including Assumption Parish.

The proposed maintenance cost for Assumption Parish Police Jury will total \$1,040,469 over a 12 year period.

Residents can review and comment on this plan from January 16, 2026 to March 2, 2026. The plan is viewable online at www.assumptionla.com or in person at the Police Jury Office in Napoleonville.

Assumption Parish is allocating all funding to the Bayou Chene Floodgate maintenance program with the St. Mary Levee District. They will sign a 50 year Cooperative Endeavor Agreement (CEA) with the St. Mary Levee District to help maintain the structure for the duration of its life expectancy. After 50 years another structure will need to be engineered and constructed. Estimated gross allocation from Assumption with BP proceeds \$1,040,469 for share of maintaining Bayou Chene Floodgate. The total cost share will be divided between St. Mary Levee Dist, Terrebonne Parish Levee Dist., Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, Assumption Parish Government, St. Martin Parish Government, Iberville Parish Government and North Lafourche Conservation, Levee and Drainage District. Attached is a multiyear budget matrix and map illustrating location.




Vicinity Map
